The apprenticeship is a cornerstone of what we do as a company. With anticipation and excitement for the future, we are now officially accepting applications for our apprentice for the 2024/25 season!

About Pacific Theatre

Pacific Theatre aspires to delight, provoke and stimulate dialogue by producing theatre that rigorously explores the spiritual aspects of human experience. In 40 seasons, Pacific Theatre has produced more than 160 professional mainstage productions, ranging from established works to original world premieres. In addition to our full season of plays, we are committed to the nurturing of emerging artists and the PT Apprenticeship program is vital to what we do. We are a tiny company with a huge heart; and, we share a commitment to artistic rigour, a sense of play, and teamwork. We create art on the unceded and shared territories of the x̱w̱məθḵw̱əy̱əm (Musqueam), Skxwú7mesh (Squamish), and səliłwətał (Tsleil-Waututh) Nations

About the Apprenticeship

Pacific Theatre offers a paid apprenticeship program for artists and administrators who are young in craft and looking to expand their skills, while being mentored by other professional theatre artists and staff. The apprentice will split their time with the company between administrative tasks and their own self-directed disciplinary focus.

Administrative

Part of the apprentice's work will include weekly administrative tasks, mostly related to Box Office and Front of House. Administrative work will average 10 hours a week. These responsibilities include:

- Answering phones, selling tickets over the phone, answering questions about the theatre and the season.
- Processing subscriptions packages.
- Checking and responding to emails.
- Assisting with Front of House duties in the evening as needed.

Disciplinary Focus

The PT Apprenticeship is tailored towards each individual participant and their area of focus. We are seeking apprentices from all theatre disciplines including, but not limited to, theatre administration, acting, community engagement, design, directing, dramaturgy, producing, playwriting, production management and technical direction. The apprentice will be paired with a mentor who can support and guide them through their time at the company.

Apprentices will also be charged with collectively producing one project of their choosing. Past examples include one-act plays, 24-hour theatre festivals, actor showcases, and new play readings. Such projects provide excellent opportunities for aspiring directors, dramaturgs, producers, and playwrights, as well as actors. We will provide a modest budget for this project.

A major goal of the apprenticeship is to provide emerging artists with an artistic home in the Vancouver theatre community and to guide and assist apprentices in their artistic endeavours. We want to establish relationships with these emerging artists that will last long after their apprenticeship ends and help connect them with the theatre community at large.

Compensation is 25 hours a week at \$18 an hour.

Desired Qualifications

- Post-secondary theatre training is an asset, but not required
- A desire to work and learn under the Pacific Theatre ethos of anti-racist theatre practice, relational integrity and a culture of care
- A curious and growth-oriented mindset and ability to take initiative
- Strong time management skills.
- Ability to work both independently and in collaboration with a team
- Customer service experience
- Strong computer skills and familiarity with Mac computers

How To Apply

Successful applicants will have read the "About Us," "[Our Season,](#)" and "[Justice and Inclusion,](#)" sections on our website, to familiarize themselves with our core values and our past work. Candidates should expect to be asked, based on this information, what draws them to working with Pacific Theatre. Please know that, even if you don't think you qualify for this role, we believe that people who are drawn to our work have a place at PT and we want to connect with you.

Please note that due to Canadian immigration laws, we are only able to accept applicants who are already legally permitted to work in Canada.
